The Welcome

- 1. Receiving a visitor
- 2. Introducing yourself
- 3. General: Talk about the trip to the office, the weather, sports, etc.
- 4. Cultural: general, non-taboo questions that can be asked about someone's country.

The Meal

- 1. Small talk in a restaurant
- 2. Talking about family, relationships and education
- 3. Keeping a conversation going (Phrases like "how about.." "but seriously.."
- 4. Thanking somebody for a meal
- 5. Conversation starters
- 6. Follow up statements and questions
- 7. Active listening / confirmation statements

Food

- 1. Explaining a menu
- 2. Typical Spanish / International foods
- 3. Deciding what to order: preferences, allergies, religious beliefs...
- 4. Questions that can and cannot be asked

After the meal

- 1. Language Summary: new vocabulary and phrases learned
- 2. Suggestions for next topics' meals
